Curriculum Newsletter Year 6 Topic- Champions.

Language, Literacy and Communication Skills	Guided Reading. VCOP (Vocabulary, Connectives, Openers, Punctuation). Handwriting. Comprehension Work. Spelling. Myths and Legends. Poetry. Children's Classics. Instructions and Explanations. Welsh -Tenses, sentence patterns, vocabulary and reading.

Percentages Find percentages of amounts Use percentages to solve problems. Manage money. Use the terms profit and loss in buying and selling activities and make calculations for this. Understand the advantages and disadvantages of using bank accounts Understand the terms deposit, withdrawal, in credit and overdrawn. Make comparisons between prices and understand which is the best value for money. Length, weigh/mass, capacity. Read and interpret scales or divisions on a range of measuring instruments. Make estimates of length, weight/mass and capacity based on the size of real life objects. Recognise the appropriateness of units in different contexts. Time Use and interpret timetables and schedules to plan events and activities and make calculations as part of the planning process. Estimate how long a journey takes. Time events in minutes and seconds to the nearest tenth of a second. Estimate the length of time everyday activities take to complete with increasing accuracy. Temperature Measure and record temperature involving positive and negative readings. Shape Recognise tetrahedra and square based pyramids. Draw cubes and cuboids on isometric paper Find all lines of symmetry for a given shape. Identify symmetrical properties of regular polygons.

The children will write instructions and explanations and they will develop additional skills using the technical vocabulary associated with sport and the human body. The children will apply their skills and understanding to create a range of new sports and games for the great Council of Athens.</p> <p>In this project the children will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • About the different parts and functions of the human body; • About the importance of healthy eating and exercise; • About the lives and cultures of the ancient <i>Greeks</i>; • How the Olympics originated and the importance of the Olympics today; • About a range of other sports and activities; • About team work, competition, perseverance and what makes a champion.
