

Dear Parents/Carers,

Please find some suggested activities to carry out at home with your child.

It would be great if the children continue to practice putting on their coats, shoes and socks independently.

Can you practice the sounds we have learned so far: m, a, s, d, t, i, n, p, g and o. The next sounds are c and k. Play eye spy using these sounds. You can make your own sound table by finding objects around the house. Play 'Kim's game' - put several objects on a tray, have a good look at them, cover the tray and remove an object. Can your child guess the missing object?

When your child is drawing or mark making please check they are using the correct triangular grip. They can practice writing their name by tracing over the top of your writing or copying underneath. Please use our new handwriting script.

Share lots of books together. Ask your child which was their favourite part/character. What happened at the beginning, middle, end? Did they like the story?

Practice counting 0-10 forwards and backwards. Make sets of objects eg buttons, teddy bears, dolls, toy cars etc. Write down numbers on card or paper and hide around the house or garden. Have a number hunt to find the numbers and practice putting into the correct order. Be a shape detective looking for squares, circles, triangles

and rectangles. Find a stick in the garden can you find one that is longer or shorter?

We have been finding out about objects which float or sink. Collect some objects and ask your child to predict if it will float or sink, then try putting them in the sink or a bowl of water to see if they were right.

Cooking together is lots of fun. Your child will practice measuring, weighing, mixing, stirring and tasting skills! Please take some photos of your creations to show us!

There are lots of play dough recipes on-line. Playing with play dough is great for strengthening hand muscles.
