

Please complete these while you are off school. You can do them in any order but you must complete AT LEAST 1 maths, 1 English, 1 Welsh and 1 topic/art activity.

<p><u>READING:</u> Please read as much as you can! Try to read for at least 30 minutes a day, maybe in two chunks.</p> <p>You can log on to www.giglets.com with your password (in the pack) and complete some of the activities that we have put there for you. There are practice reading test questions too. If you are completing these on an iPad, you have to select the text you want to underline by holding your finger down, wobbling it and then tapping!</p>	<p><u>SPELLING:</u> Practise spelling all of the high frequency words for Year 4 and then Year 5. You can find them at http://resources.mysparklebox.co.uk/6000-7000/sb6530.pdf</p> <p>You might want to experiment with using MS word or Google docs to create your own wordsearch with the words you found tricky from the lists.</p>	<p><u>TOPIC:</u> Make a PowerPoint or mini project book about something that is really important to you or that interests you. You need to include: what it is, what interests you about it, and lots of facts (put into your own words). Check your spelling and remember to use joined handwriting if you are creating a project book. Try to include pictures and/or illustrations and experiment with inserting media/hyperlinks into a PowerPoint.</p> <p>Suggested projects: Dinosaurs, The Egyptians, The Stone Age, The Victorians, The Olympics, Greek Mythology, Famous Artists</p>	<p><u>ART:</u> Draw a self portrait. Watch the YouTube tutorial first on Google Classroom. You will need a mirror to look at yourself carefully. Then practise your shading by using heavier shading for the areas of your face in shadow.</p>
<p><u>MATHS:</u> Practise all of your times tables. You should be able to answer questions on them in any order.</p> <p>1 chilli: learn your 2,5,10,3,4 2 chilli: learn all of your tables 3 chilli: learn all tables and the division facts, so $3 \times 4 = 12$, and 12 divided by 4=3.</p>	<p><u>MATHS:</u> Use a dice to generate some numbers. Look at the Sully school website at how to multiply if you cannot remember. https://www.sullyschool.co.uk/homework-help/</p> <p>1 chilli: multiply a 2 digit number by a 1 digit number using the grid method (e.g. 23×5)</p>	<p><u>MATHS:</u> log in to Abacus Active Learn and complete the activities set there for you. Go to Child, My Abacus on the Sully School website to log in or go to www.activelearnprimary.co.uk Your login details are in the pack.</p>	<p><u>WRITING:</u> Using what you already know about writing instructions, write some instructions on how to do something that you can do for someone else to follow. It might be how to juggle, how to play Minecraft, how to bake a cake etc. You must use time</p>

<p><u>WRITING:</u> Write a description of one of the pictures included in the pack. You could describe what you can see, how it makes you feel and what you think you would see, feel, hear, smell and touch there. You will need to use adjectives and adverbs. Make it as descriptive as possible!</p> <p>You may wish to use the picture as a stimulus for writing a story. You can write your story on paper or type it and email it to us.</p>	<p><u>WELSH:</u> Send an email to us describing yourself, trying to use the following patterns:ydw i (name) Dw i'n...oed (age) Dw i'n byw....
