Sully Primary School – Request to Administer Medication

A parent is ultimately responsible for the administration of his/her child's medication. Medication which is required for a few days duration, such as antibiotics, must be administered by the child's parent or a person authorised by the parent, for example, an aunt or grandparent. If a child needs medication for a long period of time, that is weeks rather than days, and would not be able to attend school without the medication being administered during the school day then the headteacher will decide if the school can assist such a pupil. There is no legal or contractual duty on school staff to administer medicine or supervise a pupil taking it. This is a voluntary role. Relevant school staff who have volunteered, must have sufficient information about a pupil with long term medical needs in order that they can provide the appropriate support for that pupil.
