<p>Dydd Llun Monday</p>	<p>Literacy LO: To become aware of the sound 'a' Watch Mrs Thomas's video introducing the sound 'a'. Can you make a sound table with objects beginning with 'a'?</p> <p>Numeracy LO: To realise that anything can be counted not just objects eg claps, steps, fingers Sing 1 little, 2 little, 3 little fingers etc with Miss Western on the seesaw video. Practice counting to 10 forwards and backwards. Hold up a number. Do that number of claps, jumps, steps etc</p> <p>Topic LO: To draw a picture of your pet Watch Miss Western's video on seesaw about pets. Please can you draw me a picture of your pet? Look closely at your pet. How many eyes, ears, noses, legs or tails do they have? Do they have whiskers? What colour is their fur? I would love to see your pictures. You could send me a photo of yourself with your pet. If you do not have a pet, maybe you could draw a picture of your Nanny or Grampy's pet, or a pet belonging to a friend or neighbour.</p>
<p>Dydd Mawrth Tuesday</p>	<p>LITERACY LO: To experiment with a range of mark making instruments Practise writing the letter 'a'. You can pour some salt onto a small plate and use a chopstick or finger to practise 'a'. You can use pens, pencils, crayons or chalks. If you go for a walk down to the beach you could practise writing an 'a' in the sand.</p> <p>NUMERACY LO: To group objects into sets and begin to communicate the rules I have used Can you find a selection of soft toy animals or plastic animal figures? What groups can you sort them into? Eg a set of dogs, cats, mice or a set of brown animals, black animals, white animals, or a set of big or small animals. Send me a photo on seesaw of your sets. The children may need help with ideas of how to sort the animals.</p> <p>TOPIC LO: To communicate meaning using extended speech Listen to Miss Western reading the story 'Jacob O'Rielly Wants A Pet' on seesaw. If you could have any pet which pet would you have. Explain to a grown up which pet you would choose and why. Ask your grown up which pet they would choose</p>

<p>Dydd Mercher</p> <p>Wednesday</p>	<p>LITERACY LO: To recognise that objects start with a different initial sound Watch Mrs Thomas's video on seesaw. She is sorting out some objects. Some begin with m or a. Can you find some objects that begin with an m and a? Match them to the letter m or a.</p> <p>NUMERACY LO: To count to 10 forwards and backwards How many objects did you find beginning with m or a? Can you touch count them? Did you find more objects beginning with m or a?</p> <p>TOPIC LO: To become aware of how we take care of our pets Watch Miss Western's video. She is going to talk about how she looks after her pet dog. What does your pet need? EG: food, water, a cage or bed, a collar, lead, toys etc. If you do not have a pet you could talk to a grown up about how Miss Western looks after her dog.</p>
<p>Dydd Iau</p> <p>Thursday</p>	<p>LITERACY LO: To follow a book read to them and respond appropriately Mrs Thomas is going to read to you the story of 'The Pet Sale'. Which Pet would you have chosen? How much did it cost? Did you enjoy the story? Which was your favourite part?</p> <p>NUMERACY LO: To exchange money for items Make a pet shop. Choose some toy animals to sell in your pet shop. Make some price labels for the pets. (I would just make labels for 1p). Practise exchanging 1p coins for the pets.</p> <p>TOPIC LO: To find out about huskies Follow the link to the cBeebies episode all about Huskie dogs. You will find out how to look after them and what they can do. Tell a grown up about what you have found out! https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b06ss462/my-pet-and-me-huskies</p>
<p>Dydd Gwener</p> <p>Friday</p>	<p>LITERACY LO: To discriminate sounds both in my environment and in words Mrs Thomas has made a game for you to play on seesaw to practise recognising which objects begin with a 'm' or 'a' sound. You can also have a look on the cBeebies website and watch the alphablocks. https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/p0872x41/alphablocks-magic-words-1-meet-alphablock-a Can you find the letter 'a' anywhere around the house?</p> <p>NUMERACY LO: To compare, sort and order objects in terms of size Who is the tallest in your family? Who is the shortest? Can you put your family into height order - tallest to shortest? Look around your house and garden. Can you find something taller than you? Can you find something shorter than you?</p> <p>TOPIC LO: To develop control of gross motor skills, moving safely in response to instructions. The children have been taking part in Cosmic Kids yoga sessions in the classroom. If you go onto youtube and search for Cosmic kids yoga - Parsnip the cat. The children can follow Jamie in the yoga session. Have fun!</p>
