Please note we will be closed for INSET on Friday 9th February. During this training day, staff will be working with colleagues across the cluster on a number of initiatives including curriculum mapping, assessment and wellbeing strategies.

School attendance figures across Wales have dropped remarkably since COVID. News on the horizon regarding this, is that the Welsh Government will shortly be issuing a statement which will be asking schools to commence attendance monitoring for all children whose attendance falls below 90% and not 80% as it currently stands. 90% attendance equates to a child missing 20 days of schooling. This amount of absence has a hugely detrimental effect on a child's academic performance and wellbeing. Whilst we understand a poorly child should not be made to attend school at any costs, we do urge our families to consider the implications of taking holidays during school terms and to avoid taking children out of school for the odd day here and there, as these days soon mount up.

This will tell us what diversity of bird life we have in the community by getting together in the Jubilee Hall at 4.00pm on Sunday 28th to share our results, have a cuppa and one (or more) of Cllr Bowring's famous Welsh Cakes. This year could be particularly interesting as the cold weather may bring some unusual species into our gardens; redwings, fieldfares, maybe the odd waxwing. To our surprise the RSPB tell us that we're breaking new ground with this, they know of no other comparable community initiative, so let's make it work!'

Year 1 HB enjoyed learning how to log onto hwb and use the paint program! They are looking forward to their hwb homework!






Year 2AM have peeled, grated and chopped to create three different soups as part of their new unit of learning, 'Farm to Fork'.

The leek and potato was a firm favourite!




